Just a Reminder!!!

For those parents who may be taking their children out of the daycare for the summer months, please be aware that your child will have to register again in the Fall, or you can reserve your spot by paying **NOW or before June 3rd**. This year a \$25 fee will have to be paid weekly to reserve the spot during the summer for Fall Session. Otherwise, you will not have availability in the Fall. Don't forget the daycare will be closed on May 30th – 31st to observe



Just a Note: Please make sure your child is well groomed when coming to school.

Preventing Mosquito Bites:

- *Most commonly your best options are to avoid the hours of the day when mosquito activity is highest--dawn and dusk.*
- *Avoiding areas where mosquitoes are most prevalent is also helpful. This would include ponds, bayous, and other areas of stagnant water.*
- *Certainly, applying insect repellent to exposed skin or even to the outside of clothing can be extremely helpful. The American Academy of Pediatrics suggests repellents that contain DEET with no more than a 30% concentration. Another repellent option contains picaridin. It has a more pleasant smell and is less oily on the skin. They also recommend not applying any repellents to children under the age of 2 months. At the end of the day, make sure to wash the areas of skin treated with repellent. Remember, the very high majority of mosquito bites are nuisances. I hope your kids have a great time at camp.*
